2005 Program Accomplishments

2005 Program Goals

- Obtain, repair and deliver 60 recycled bicycles in 2005.
- Enhance auditing system to include mechanized recording of volunteer hours.
- Restore and auction donated 'classic' bicycles.
- Acquire a permanent facility to house the Bike Recycling program.
- Re-establish the youth program and move it to the permanent facility.

2005 Program Accomplishments

- Bicycles delivered¹:
 - Adult - 44
 - Kids - 18
 - Total - 62
- Auditing system enhanced to include:
 - Tracking of volunteers and hours (37 volunteers with 200+ hours since 08/01/2005)
 - Generation of reports
- Six bicycles sold for a total gross revenue of \$905
- Established relationship with UGA Police to obtain impounded bicycles
 - 64 received from private donors
 - 32 received from ACC Police
 - 3 received from UGA Police²
 - 99 bicycles in database
- Enhanced work facility
 - Expanded facility from 200 to 400 square feet
 - Added generator and battery powered lighting
 - Purchased two workstands
 - Scrounged tool tables and work bench
 - Added another parts storage rack
- Made numerous enquiries about permanent facility. No facility within budget found. Farmer's Market space still vacant although environmental assessment shows asbestos and lead paint exists in facility.
- No progress on youth program
